



Supportive Clinical Information Fever in the Neonate less than 28 days Emergency

Factors Associated with HSV	HSV Laboratory Features
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Maternal HSV infection prior to delivery• Intrapartum genital HSV lesions• Postnatal HSV contact• Vesicular skin rash• Eye and/or mouth manifestations (lesions, vesicles, ulcers)• Hepatosplenomegaly• Seizures• Septic appearance (including irritability, apneas, hypotension, lethargy)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• CSF pleocytosis greater than 20 WBC/mm³ + negative gram stain• Thrombocytopenia (platelets less than 50,000)• Elevated transaminases
